MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT





Introduction

Modern slavery takes many forms, including forces labour, servitude, slavery and Human trafficking and no industry sector or jurisdiction is immune.

Planet Travel is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery anywhere in our business.

We are constantly developing and updating our processes to help us ensure that we are satisfied with whom we deal and how they operate.

Our business

Planet Travel (Travel Business Company) operating across the world. We put our customers at the heart of everything, and our employees work hard to facilitate our customers business travel trips.

Our values and policies

We are committed to working sustainably responsibly and ethically and this is set out in our Code of Conduct for Travel Planet employees, which provides guidance and how we expect our employees to behave and what to do if they suspect anyone is falling short of these behaviours.

Planet Travel Code of Ethics and Conduct includes:

- support and respect the protection of internationally recognised human rights;
- treat all employees with dignity and respect and not use any threats of violence, sexual exploitation, abuse or verbal or psychological harassment;
- ensure that our workplace and environment does not endanger the physical integrity or health employees; and
- observe the law and any relevant binding codes of practices in all countries in which we operate.

This always includes acting with integrity in our business dealings.

We expect the same high standards of behaviour from our suppliers as we do from ourselves

Training

Our employees are aware of our Code of Conduct and the high standard expected by Travel Planet. We are committed to train our employees so that they fully understand the behaviour required of them, stay alert to the issues and can spot where acts of modern slavery could occur.

Raising concern

We believe that we all have a responsibility to be aware of the risk of modern slavery and human trafficking in our business. In our Code of Conduct we encourage employees to speak out if they have any concerns.

The UK Modern Slavery 2015 requires certain commercial organisation to publish an annual transparency statement disclosing the steps taken to ensure that modern slavery and human trafficking do not exist in their business or supply chains.

This statement has been published pursuant to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act and sets out the steps that Planet Travel has taken for financial year ended 31 December 2020 to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking in our business.
